Winners were greatly honoured by having poems sung about their deeds. Originally these were held as games of friendship, and any wars in the progress were halted to allow the games to take place. The Greeks attached so much importance to these games that they calculated time in four-year cycles called 'Olympiads' dating from 776 BC.

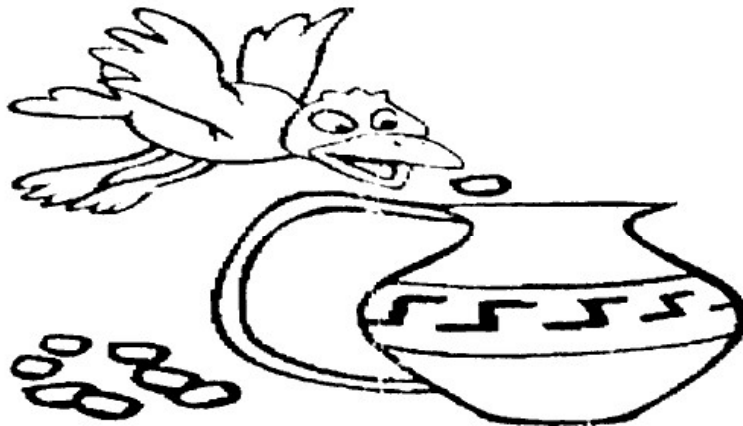
