The first step would be to convince people to care about environment by providing simple alternative solutions and ways of doing things. The Internet is a powerful tool and a group of likeminded people can be formed on social media. With the current state that our planet is in, it is imperative that people actively care about the environment and most importantly, act now.



Similarly the other area would be our kitchen. All kitchen waste should be collected separately. Those who have green fingers can turn the waste into valuable manure. Dig a pit and put the kitchen waste into it. When the pit is half full, cover it up with mud. Let nature do the rest. Within three to six months you can have a good garden manure.
